Robin Bray Museum-Based Learning Award Application Form: School Year September 2019-June 2020

The Robin Bray Museum-Based Learning Award honors the memory of a local teacher who supported student learning through the use of experiences beyond the classroom. It annually provides a professional development stipend of \$500 to a Blue Hill, Brooksville, Bucksport (including Orland, Prospect, and Verona Island), Penobscot, Sedgwick or Surry 5th through 8th grade teacher to develop a project that integrates the resources of the Wilson Museum with a regular curriculum component in their classroom. Teachers of all disciplines are encouraged to consider developing a project that would be enriched by the resources and support provided by the Wilson Museum.

The project will support CCSS and MLR and will include at least one class field trip to the Museum.
